Hello and welcome!

Welcome to Snow White, a family theatre production by NIE New International Encounter.

This show is a playful retelling of the classic Brothers Grimm fairy tale, Snow White. It features live music, songs, and moments where you're welcome to clap along and join in.

At times, the show may be loud or very quiet. Some scenes might feel a little sad, tense, or worrying — but remember, it's just a story, and everything turns out okay in the end. If anything feels overwhelming, you can always talk to a trusted adult, like a parent, carer, or teacher. You are welcome to leave the theatre at any time if you need a break.



The performance lasts approximately 75 minutes.
Please note that there is no interval.

If you require any assistance before, during or after the show, please talk to one of the event team staff, who will be happy to help.

Photos used in this visual story are taken from the 2018 version of Snow White, so the stage show may look slightly different to the pictures in this guide.

What will it look like?

The stage will mainly look like a wintery wood, with trees around the outside.

The story is told in 2 different places.



The Palace

Where the Queen Lives.



The Woods

Where the Eartherbergers live in their woodland house.

The actors might move objects around to create different places, and objects will come down from the ceiling.

Sometimes it might be dark in the auditorium. Sometimes it might be bright.

The Cast

There are 6 actors in the show who pretend to be various characters in the story.

They might talk to you and they might use unusual voices for their character.

They will play instruments, sing and dance. You can join in and cheer if you want.

The Story

Snow White lived with her jealous stepmother, Queen Ykaterina. The Queen's mirror said Snow White was the fairest — and the Queen got angry. She sent Jakob to get rid of her, but he let her go.

Snow White ran into the forest and found the friendly Earthbergers. They welcomed her.



The Queen tried to trick Snow White — with a corset, a comb, and a poisoned apple. Snow White fell into a deep sleep. Jakob returned, hugged her - and she woke up!

The Queen came back, still angry, but the Earthbergers made her say sorry. They forgave her. All was well again.



Triggers /Considerations

The play is full of fun, songs, and happy moments, but there are a few scenes that might feel a bit scary or upsetting. It's okay to take a break if you need to.

Here are a few scenes to be aware of:



The Queen gets jealous and tries to hurt Snow White. She shouts and gets angry sometimes.



The Queen tells Jakob to kill Snow White but, he doesn't do it.



Snow White runs away alone into the dark forest. She's sad and scared.



The Queen disguises herself and tricks Snow White three times — with a corset, a comb, and a poisoned apple.



Snow White falls down twice and lies very still. The music gets quiet and the characters act sad.



Some characters cry or get upset, especially when they think Snow White has died.



The Queen can act creepy and be loud and wears disguises — but she is also a funny character.
